
# **RSU 23 Board Minutes**

#### Superintendent's Report

Wanted to remind everyone of the regional budget meeting being held on Thursday, May 18<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 in the cafeteria at Old Orchard Beach High School. That is the meeting tax payers attend and vote on each individual cost centers of the budget. He would like to see as many tax payers as possible participating in the meeting. He also sent out a letter to all the families in the district and the students at the High School regarding the Netflix series "Thirteen Reason's Why", which is about a girl who commits suicide. The letter explained how we can deal with the situation and help students. If anyone has any concerns please feel free to reach out to me to talk about this. Last week the high school received our national accreditation certificate and letter from NEASC. Although we knew they would recommend continued accreditation, it was nice to get those documents in the mail knowing we achieved our goal. ## **New Business**

A motion was made by Peter Flaherty and seconded by Michelle Violette to adopt the proposed 2017-2018 Budget of \$13, 789,753.33 as presented. Voted unanimously. Motion Approved.

A motion was made by Michelle Violette and seconded by Peter Flaherty to accept George Shabo as Behavioral Specialist, Patricia Elsemiller as K-2 Interventionist, Kristine Maturo as K-2 Interventionist, Joanne Dowd as Director of Instruction and Nancy Smith as K-12 psychologist. Voted Unanimously. Motion Approved.

Peter Flaherty read the 1<sup>st</sup> readings on policies IHBEA: LAU Plan- Program for Limited English Proficient Students and KBF-E2: Title 1 School-Parent Compact. All policies can be found on the website if anyone would like to read them.

David Boudreau announced the winning bids for the (3) 81-passenger buses to WC Cressey at \$83,418.00/each, 1 transit van to Yankee Ford at \$31,582.00 and 2 mini vans to Lee Dodge at \$24,599.00/each.

A motion was made by Michelle Violette and seconded by Peter Flaherty to approve the lease purchase agreement for the buses and vans in the amount of \$79,826.41 per year. Voted unanimously. Motion Approved.

A motion was made by Michelle Violette and seconded by Peter Flaherty to accept the renewal of the interlocal adult education agreement as presented. Voted unanimously. Motion Approved.

#### **Committee Reports**

David Boudreau reported on the finance committee. They met and went over some financial items and the main focus was opening of the bus bids. You do know the results of that. Everyone has worked hard to reach our goal this year. We are actually in the black. Thank you to Mrs. Cox for being the eagle eye and keeping a close eye on the budget. People in the community have commented that we are in the best shape we have been in, in many, many years. It's great we can fund a new playground and other things for our students.
