<b>Jolly Grammar and Spelling Grades 1-2</b>	<p><b>Presenter:</b> Rachel Griffin, certified <i>Jolly Grammar</i> trainer. Rachel has taught in England and in France and now she lives in Pennsylvania. She has completed the University of Kansas Reading Specialist program. Jolly Grammar, which follows Jolly Phonics, provides teachers with a systematic and multi-sensory way to teach grammar and spelling. It uses actions and colors to help children identify parts of speech in sentences. Punctuation, morphemes, and sentence development are taught explicitly and address Common Core Language Standards. Jolly Grammar also focuses on extending children’s knowledge of the alphabetic code, beyond that covered in Jolly Phonics, to aid both spelling and reading skills.</p>	Grades 1-2 Teachers	<b>June 24(10:00-12:00)</b>
