In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify the voters of the Town of Old Orchard Beach that the Regional School Unit Budget Meeting will be held at the Old Orchard Beach High School, 40 E. Emerson Cummings Blvd., Old Orchard Beach, Maine at 7:00PM on May 14, 2024 for the purpose of determining the Budget Meeting articles set forth below.

ARTICLE 1A: To elect a moderator to preside at the meeting.

ARTICLES 1 THROUGH 11 AUTHORIZE EXPENDITURES IN COST CENTER CATEGORIES

ARTICLE 1: To see what sum the Regional School Unit will be authorized to expend for Regular Instruction.

Regular Instruction Teachers, and Ed Techs, ESL, Gifted and Talented, and Alternative Education budgets

ARTICLE 2: To see what sum the Regional School Unit will be authorized to expend for Special Education.

ARTICLES 12 THROUGH 13 RAISE FUNDS FOR THE PROPOSED SCHOOL BUDGET

ARTICLE 12: The School Board recommends that the RSU appropriate the amounts set forth below for the total cost of funding public education from Kindergarten to grade 12 as described in the Essential Programs and Services Funding Act and raise and assess the amounts set forth below as each municipality's contribution to the total cost of funding public education from kindergarten to grade 12 as described in the Essential Programs and Services Funding Act in accordance with the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 20-A, section 15688.

Explanation: The Regional School Unit's contribution to the total cost of funding public education from kindergarten to grade 12 as described in the Essential Programs and Services Funding Act is the amount of money determined by state law to be the minimum amount that the Regional School Unit must raise and assess in order to receive the full amount of state dollars.

ARTICLE 13: The School Board recommends that the RSU raise and appropriate \$6,025,113.58 in additional local funds, which exceeds the State's Essential Programs and Services allocation model by \$6,025,113.58 as required to fund the budget recommended by the School Board.

The School Board gives the following reasons for exceeding the State's Essential Programs and Services funding model by \$6,025,113.58: The Regional School Unit's contribution to the total cost of funding public education from kindergarten to grade 12 as described in the Essential Programs and Services Funding Act is the amount of money determined by state law to be the minimum amount that the Regional School Unit must raise and assess in order to receive the full amount of state dollars.

State Mandated Explanation: The additional local funds are those locally raised funds over and above the RSU's local contribution to the total cost of funding public education from kindergarten to grade 12 as described in the Essential Programs and Services Funding Act and local amounts raised for the annual payment on non-state funded debt service that will help achieve the RSU budget for educational programs.

ARTICLE 14 SUMMARIZES THE PROPOSED SCHOOL BUDGET

ARTICLE 14: The School Board recommends that the RSU authorize the School Board to expend \$16,919,520.11 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2024 and ending June 30, 2025, from the RSU's contribution to the total cost of funding public education from kindergarten to grade 12 as described in the Essential Programs and Services Funding Act, non-state-funded school construction projects, additional local funds for school purposes under the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 20-A, section 15690, unexpended balances, tuition receipts, state subsidy and other receipts for the support of schools.

ARTICLE 15 AUTHORIZES EXPENDITURE OF GRANTS AND OTHER RECEIPTS

ARTICLE 15: In addition to amounts approved in the preceding articles, shall the School Board be authorized to expend such other sums as may be received from federal or state grants or programs or other sources during the fiscal year for school purposes, provided that such grants, programs or other sources do not require the expenditure of other funds not previously appropriated?

ARTICLE 16 AUTHORIZES THE ADULT EDUCATION PROGRAM AND RAISES THE LOCAL SHARE

ARTICLE 16: To see if Regional School Unit No. 23 will appropriate \$699,844.82 for adult education and raise \$140,577.83 as the local share; with authorization to expend any additional, incidental, or miscellaneous receipts in the interest and for the well-being of the adult education program.

<u>ARTICLE 17 AUTHORIZES A CONTINGENCY FUND</u>

ARTICLE 17: Shall the RSU authorize the School Board to transfer funds in excess of the 9% state guideline from unallocated balances, to the RSU's non-lapsing contingency fund for periods of financial emergency pursuant to section 1482-B(3) of Title 20-A, and shall the RSU delegate authority to the School Board to expend sums in the contingency fund when the School Board determines by public vote that an emergency need exists, and to transfer sums in the contingency fund to the RSU's general fund for use in school operating budgets approved by RSU voters?

School Board Recommends a "Yes" Vote.

ARTICLE 18 AUTHORIZES TRANSFERS TO AND EXPENDITURES FROM A CAPITAL RESERVE FUND

ARTICLE 18: Capital Reserve Fund. Shall the School Board be authorized to transfer up to \$250,000 from available fund balances to the Capital Reserve Fund; to expend up to \$1,000,000 from said reserve fund for the HS roof replacement project. Also, any maintenance costs of a capital project required by law or in the event of an emergency as determined by the School Board following a public hearing?
