Third Grade

Recently, third graders experienced two field trips! First, we visited the Merrill Auditorium to see a performance of Cirque Afrique. Students acted respectfully as we were awed by the performers' thrilling abilities! The field trip gave our students a deeper understanding of the culture in Africa. Mrs. Shaw joined us to learn about the kora, djembe and traditional African music. Mrs. Hurteau also connected her curriculum to this field trip as students designed acrobats in art! You can see how students were inspired by the performance in their final products.

The very next day, students went to the Maine Warrior Gym. Our hearts were warmed by the respect and acceptance our students received from each other as they took on extreme physical challenges like a warped wall, parkour equipment and swinging monkey bars!



Fourth Grade

The entire fourth grade has been exploring measuring length, mass, and capacity using the Metric System. They have also started Flex Groups two times a week to practice targeted reading skills based on gradewide data. In addition, Ms. Steven's class visited third grade classes to teach them some fun dice math games to practice addition and subtraction fluency.



Sixth Grade

In October, sixth graders had the opportunity to spend a week at The Leadership School at Camp Kieve! They were immersed in experiential learning, practicing teamwork, self-confidence, communication skills and reflection. Students participated in an outdoor ropes course, indoor rock climbing, beautiful nature walks, and many team-building activities. This program allows students to build leadership skills they can take back and apply to our classrooms, school and beyond. It was an amazing week watching students challenge themselves and support each other.



Loranger Community Science News

Seventh grade science students conducted a crab investigation at Pond Cove in Cape Elizabeth. Following protocols from the Gulf of Maine Research Institute (GMRI), they collected data on each crab they found in their quadrats, then submitted the data to GMRI.



Fifth grade and the **6-8 science enrichment group** participated in year two of the Ash and Hemlock Stewards Project. A fifth grade group held a bake sale during conferences to raise money to buy predator beetles to eat hemlock wooly adelgid (HWA), an insect that attacks hemlock trees. The science enrichment group created a poster about native trees for the kiosk at the new parking lot on Portland Ave for the Milliken Mills Woods conservation area.



As part of the Ash Protection Project, students had a unique opportunity to participate in a weaving workshop with local basketmaker, Minsis Sapiel. She helped them weave brown ash and sweetgrass to make bookmarks.



Unified Soccer


